

Holiday Camp – Code of Conduct

Shepway Sports Trust is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of everybody who attends our holiday camps. We believe that it is important that participants, coaches, administrators and parents show respect and demonstrate an understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Holiday camps should be a positive experience for young people, where they can learn new things in a safe environment. Parents are encouraged to read our code of conduct with their children and talk about the way they are expected to behave when they attend our holiday camps.

Young people:

We expect all of our young people to be a HERO, following these important values:

HONESTY:

We expect everybody to be honest and play fairly with others.

ENTHUSIASM:

We expect everybody to have a positive attitude, give everything a go and take part with lots of energy.

RESPECT:

We expect everybody to be respectful to others, including coaches and guests, and treat our equipment as if it is their own.

OLYMPIAN:

We expect everybody to try their best and be a positive role-model to others; whether in their sport, behaviour or attitude.

All of our heroes have three lives, but they will lose a life if they are not following our HERO values. Once a hero has lost all three lives, they will be sent home and may not be able to return for a period of time which will be decided by our coaching team.

There are some things that we will not accept at our holiday camps, which may result in a hero losing all three lives immediately. However, if a child follows our HERO values, we hope the following things wouldn't happen:

- Violence
- Bullying
- Using foul, abusive or offensive language
- Using mobile phones during activities
- Not respecting differences between everybody in terms of age, gender, race, ethnic origin, religious beliefs, sexual orientation or disability.

Parents and guardians:

In order to provide a safe, secure and positive environment for children to participate in activities, we ask for the help of parents and guardians.

We ask parents and guardians to:

- 1) Arrive on time
- 2) Bring children to our holiday camps with everything they need to participate: comfortable clothing, trainers or soft-soled shoes, spare clothes (if required), a water bottle and enough lunch and snacks to sustain their energy levels.
- 3) Fill in a medical document (if necessary) and hand all medication to our coaching team.
- 4) Respect coaches and their decisions
- 5) Be a positive role-model for children
